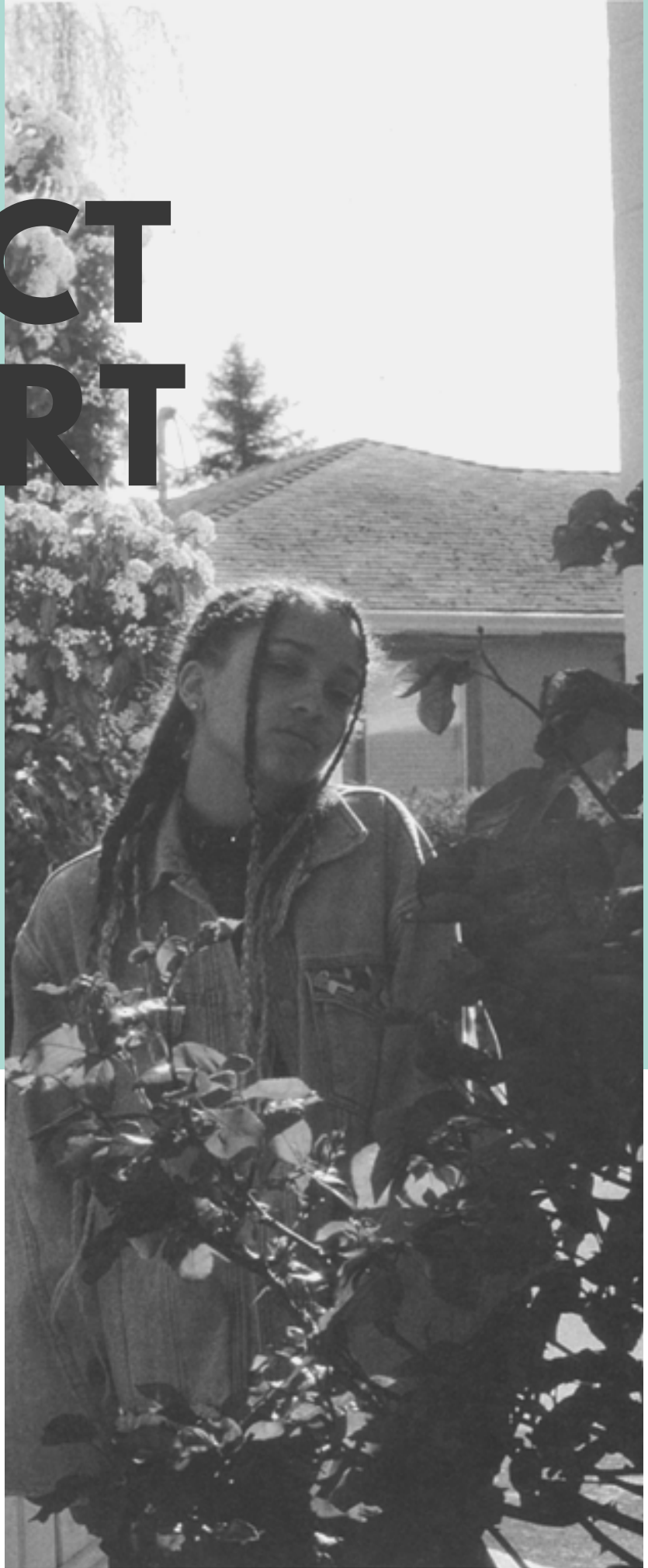

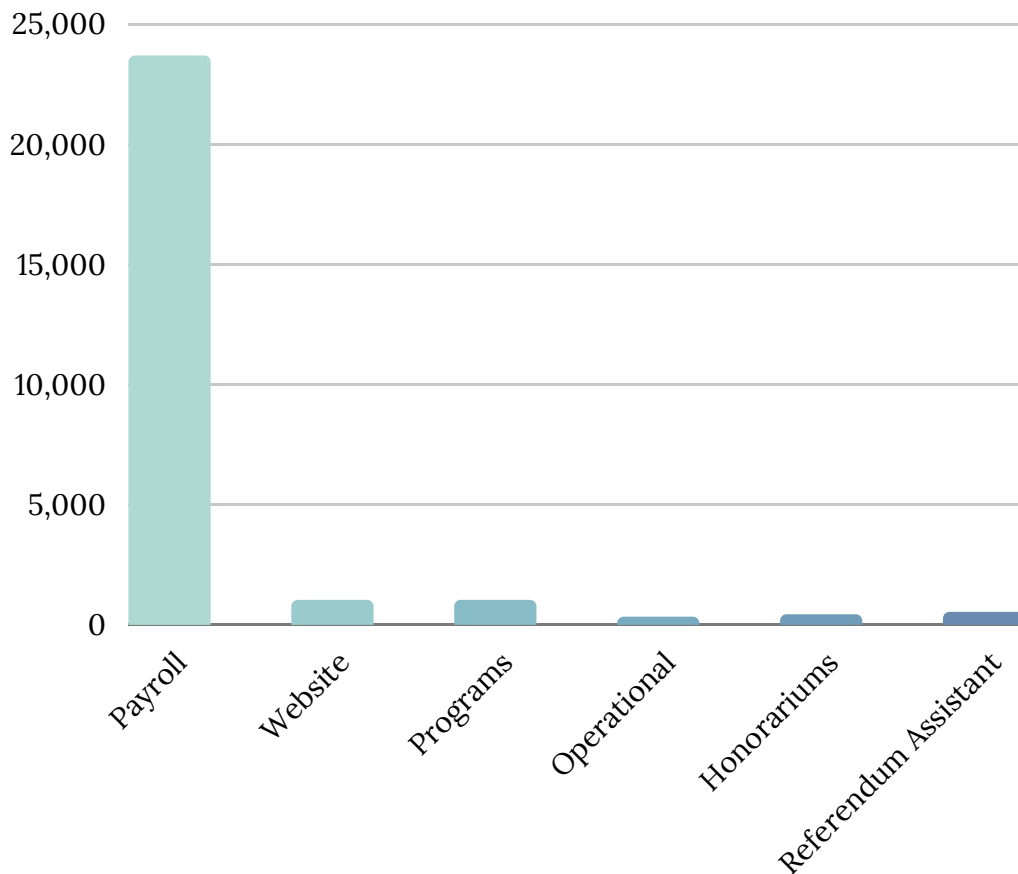

SOCC's budget comes from student fee levy at the University of Victoria (UVic). Currently, SOCC receives \$.77 per full time student from fees. This year we attempted to increase our funding through referendum, and although we received more yes votes than no votes, the question failed to meet quorum. Increasing our operating budget will continue to be an organizational priority.
